The odd and even pages of the paper are different. The name, the affiliation, and the e-mail address of the author(s) are required. The affiliation is required being specified as shown in this example. Do NOT USE special characters, symbols, or math in your title or abstract.

Keywords: About 5 keywords should be provided.

1. Introduction

The title of each section is written with bold Times New Roman font with size 14-point. The text should be in Times New Roman font with size 12-point.

A manuscript text file containing title, abstract, keywords, contents, acknowledgments, reference list, and appendices (if necessary). All manuscripts must be in English. These guidelines include complete descriptions of the fonts, spacing, and related information for producing your CUE-J manuscripts.

2. Materials and Methods

Manuscript should be no longer than 4,500 words and the combined number of figures and tables should not exceed 12 pages. The inclusion of more figures and tables will reduce the word allowance, and vice versa.

Manuscript should be prepared single column, 1.5 line spacing for editorial and proof-reader's marks. 12-point Times New Roman font should be used throughout and all pages numbered consecutively.

2.1 Figures

Place figures at the top or bottom of columns. Avoid placing them in the middle of columns. Figure captions should be below the figures. Insert figures after they are cited in the text. Use the abbreviation "Fig. 1", even at the beginning of a sentence. Use 10-point Times New Roman for Figure labels as shown in Fig. 1.

2.1 Tables

Place tables at the top or bottom of columns. Avoid placing them in the middle of columns. Table heads should appear above the tables. Insert tables after they are cited in the text. Use 12-point Times New Roman for Table labels.

3. Results and Discussion

All measures should be reported in SI units followed if necessary, in the text, by traditional units in parentheses. The quantity “billion” (10⁹ in America, 1,012 in Europe) is ambiguous and should be avoided.

Line drawings should be of high resolution and high contrast. Black-and-white or color photographs may be accepted provided they are of high quality.

4. Conclusions

Manuscript must be written using high-quality language. For non-native English language authors, the article should be proof-read by a language specialist. Poor use of English could result in immediate rejection of the paper.

Acknowledgments

Put applicable sponsor acknowledgments here; DO NOT place them on the first page of your paper or as a footnote. Acknowledgments should be as brief as possible, in a separate section before the references.

References

Citations of published literature in the text should be given in APA in-text style. APA uses the author’s last name and the year of publication. All references mentioned in the Reference list must be cited in the text, and vice versa.

- One author: (Klingman, 1992)
- two authors: (Chen & Li, 2001)

- three or more authors: (Chen et al., 2001)

If the name forms part of a sentence, it should be followed by the year in parenthesis;

- One author: Klingman (1992)
- two authors: Chen and Li (2001)
- three or more authors: Chen et al. (2001)

The References section at the end of the manuscript should list all, only the references cited in the text in alphabetical order of the first author's surname and no number in front of each reference. Titles of the journal or conference proceedings are not abbreviated. The following are examples of reference writing.
